Annual malaria review and planning meeting for IST/ESA: ZANZIBAR, TANZANIA, 13-18 SEPTEMBER 2010

1. Background

The annual Malaria review and planning meetings are convened every year for malaria programme managers and NPOs in the WHO/AFRO sub regions. The objectives of these meetings are to review the malaria control programme achievements of the previous year and to plan activities for the next year. In addition, the ARPM is a good forum for countries to share experiences and best practices and to discuss together cross cutting challenges towards improved program performance to attain set targets for the year and the RBM targets and MDGs. The meetings also serve to provide technical updates that inform and guide country planning and implementation. At these meetings WHO provides support to countries in planning and in identifying future country technical support needs and coordinating various partner activities in the sub-region.

During the 2009 ARPM, countries reviewed their programme implementation progress towards the 2010 RBM targets and developed operational plans and "road map" for the achievement of the 2010 targetes of universal coverage. After more than 10 years of program implementation towards Abuja targets and MDGs, it is important for countries to know where they are now on that road maps they developed. Therefore the 2010 ARPM provides an opportunity for countries to give an account on how they have progressed towards achieving 2010 Abuja targets of universal coverage and other MDGs. A tracking tool was developed to identify the level of program performance in SADC countries. In addition to program performance, the proposed ARPM meeting will also assess country performance on absorption of funds from Global Fund, President Malaria Initiative, World Bank etc.

With unprecedented achievements being registered in the ESA sub-region with some countries well positioned towards programme orientation of pre-elimination, the 2010 ARPM will aim to concretize these achievements. These countries will be supported to boldly take on various activities in preparation for the new programme orientation. One of the areas for focus is malaria surveillance based on reporting of malaria attributed cases and deathsin space and time. However, in some of these countries the essential prerequisites for pre-elimination implementation such as effective health systems; well designed epidemiological and management information systems, adequate and sustained funding, careful evidence-based planning, enough trained human resources; and good programme management capacity are still lacking.

Countries should have robust malaria surveillance systems to be able to generate important information that could be useful for reporting on 2010 Abuja targets and MDGs 4 and 6. It is against this background and the need to address the above challenges that this year's meeting should focus on assess country progress towards achieving 2010 RBM targets It is in line with this that the theme of the 2010 ARPM conference has been coined as "Strengthen country routine surveillance systems and establish databases" with the slogan "Robust malaria surveillance systems towards malaria pre-elimination". The ARPM will be held in Zanzibar, Tanzania between the 14 and17 September 2010.

2. Overall Objective

To provide a forum for programme review, experiences sharing and joint planning for better implementation of malaria control interventions towards malaria pre-elimination

2.1. Specific objectives

- 1. To share information on best practices related to malaria indicators surveys (MIS) and malaria program reviews (MPR) and Malaria Strategic Planning
- 2. To update countries on technical and management issues related to malaria control and prevention and strategic orientations towards malaria pre elimination.
- 3. To review country road maps progress, programme performance towards the 2010 Abuja targets of universal coverage and malaria elimination and MDGs 4 and 6 and performance based funding
- 4. To assist countries to generate important information that could be useful for producing Annual country malaria reports and reporting on 2010 Abuja targets and MDGs 4 and 6.
- 5. To provide a forum for partners to share experiences and coordination of malaria control activities.
- 6. To finalize the 2011 -2012 country malaria action plans including technical assistance required

2.2. Expected outcomes

- a. Information on best practices related to MIS, MPR and MSPs
- b. Countries updated on technical and management issues related to malaria control and prevention and strategic orientations towards malaria pre elimination
- c. Country road maps progress towards 2010 targets and performance reviewed
- d. Annual country malaria and 2010 Abuja targets and MDGs 4 and 6 reports drafted.
- e. A forum for partners to share experiences and coordination of malaria control activities provided
- f. Countries 2011-2012 malaria action plans including technical assistance required finalized.

3. Method of work

3.1 Plenary presentations and discussions: The meeting will be held in plenary presentations followed by interactive discussions.

3.2. Working group sessions:

Group work will also be used in discussing on key issues related to the generating of important information that could be useful for reporting on 2010 Abuja targets and MDGs 4 and 6. Country by country group work will be done to agree on the way forward by country. Plenary will also be used to agree on general issues for the way forward.

For country planning, the countries will be grouped according to the level of program implementation and the country specific needs. A team of facilitators drawn from the ESA IST and other partners will be allocated to each group to interact with the countries to clarify country level

implementation and identify technical needs to improve program performance with emphasis on sstrengthening of the current surveillance system

- **3.3. IST-ESAMC team and country team interaction meetings**: This interaction will enable the IST/ESA team to monitor country performance based on agreed on appropriate milestones for each country towards the set goals. The same method will be used for the planning session except that this time facilitators will interact with individual countries. Lessons from the review together with the general agreements that will emanate from plenary discussions and interactive meetings will be considered during the planning session.
- **3.4. Special session on routine malaria surveillance** with special focus on routine monitoring of logistics, coverage and impact. This session will be ran back to back with the SARN constituencies meeting and will use both plenary presentations and working group sessions.

4. Working Language

The meeting will be conducted in English with simultaneous interpretation in both French and Portuguese .
