





## The multisectoral guides contain case studies and best practices across 8 sectors



# The guide provides a step-by-step process to develop and implement a multisectoral strategy





Advocacy, action, resource mobilisation, and accountability to support the implementation of the NSP

Identify who at the global, regional, national and subnational level can support multisectoral action

Assess the investment case and broader health impact on the other sectors

Find areas of strategic overlap and benefit between malaria and the various sectors

Mobilise the resources, and develop the capabilities and policy frameworks that are needed to coordinate multisectoral action with and within that sector

#### How to use the guides

#### The multisectoral guides can help:

- Inspire and inform new, strategic multisectoral engagements
- Help identify shared goals and mutual areas of opportunity across sectors
- Advocate for malaria-smart practices and policies outside the health sector
- Support the creation of a policy framework conducive to multisectoral action
- Promote multidisciplinary research to generate evidence supporting multisectoral action and to identify gaps
